Legislation

Under EU Directive 45/2014 EU member states are required to mutually recognise a certificate of roadworthiness issued for a commercial vehicle by another member state. However, an out-of-state certificate of roadworthiness is required only to be recognised provided the certificate issued in respect of that vehicle is still valid by reference to the test frequency established under current Irish Testing Regulations.

Data Protection and Application Processing
